En el tercer i últim mòdul d'aquest llibre hi ha un apèndix amb material essencial per a l'aprenent avançat de la llengua anglesa, com per exemple: abreviacions típiques angleses, taules de conversió i càlcul, els verbs irregulars anglesos traduïts al català i al castellà, el sistema de puntuació anglès, un quadre sinòptic dels temps verbals en anglès, etc. Al final del llibre s'hi pot trobar la bibliografia i una sèrie de webs i enllaços recomanats per ambdues autores per tal de facilitar el procés d'aprenentatge de l'alumne en l'anglès com a llengua estrangera i per a finalitats específiques.
